MS. TALIARENI: In January 2011, Kamilah
Willingham and the defendant, Brandon Winston, were
both students at Harvard Law School, and they had been
friendly with each other for about a year at that time.
And on the night of January 14th, 2011, a Friday night,
Kamilah Willingham had plans to go out and do something
with her friend, who had been her
friend since high school and they stayed in touch.

And during the day on January 14th, Kamilah was also communicating with the defendant and texting him, and he asked if he could come over. She said sure, and he did so that evening.

They hung out for a little while, and eventually came over, as well as another friend of Kamilah's from law school named And the four of them were all hanging out. They were drinking some alcohol and at one point Kamilah, and the defendant had some cocaine, and they all did a line of cocaine. And wasn't there when that happened and didn't participate in that.

And eventually they decided that they wanted to go out to a bar or something, so they decided to go to the Middlesex Lounge in Cambridge. And the four of them got in a cab and went there together. And when

at that time, so intoxicated that the last thing she really remembers from that night is going into the Middlesex Bar and being handed a drink. She really has no memory of the events at the bar or after that until the next morning, when she woke up back at Kamilah's apartment in Cambridge, in Kamilah's bed, wearing nothing on the top, her tank top off, and her bra tangled in her hair and her earring.

Back at the Middlesex when Kamilah was there, she was dancing with some people and saw that appeared to be unbalanced and seemed unsteady on her feet. She and defendant even had a conversation about it at one point, and she thought the defendant was being really helpful with and trying to help her because she seemed so intoxicated on that night.

The three of them, when the bar was closing, left together. _____ at that point, had already left the bar and they didn't see him for the rest of the night, but Kamilah, ____ and the defendant walked outside and eventually found a cab and went back to Kamilah's apartment. The defendant had left his bike there earlier, before they went to the bar.

When they got back there, Kamilah and went inside and up to Kamilah's apartment on the fifth

floor. The defendant stayed downstairs, paid for the cab, but eventually he came upstairs, as well. And when walked into Kamilah's apartment, she took off her winter coat, she fell into Kamilah's bed and passed out. She was still wearing leggings under her jeans, as well as a bra and underwear, a tank top over the bra, as well as a long zip-up sweater. And she had worn all of that to the Middlesex. And the only thing she took off when she came into the apartment, before she hit the bed, was her winter coat.

went to the bathroom and actually got sick. And when she came back into the room she saw that was unconscious and that the defendant was sitting on the bed with She decided that she would get in the bed, as well, but she wanted to position herself between the defendant and because at that time had only met the defendant on one prior occasion, that fall in 2010 when they'd all gone to a jazz club. So she didn't want waking up next to the defendant.

So she tried to put herself between him and

And the defendant moved her on the other side of
him so that he was in between and Kamilah. And
when Kamilah got in that position, she fell asleep.

The next thing she remembers, waking up in the early-morning hours, in the middle of the night basically, and the defendant was on top of her. She reached out and she felt naked skin, and she realized that was and that her tank top was no longer on and her bra wasn't on her chest, that she could feel because she was feeling her naked back.

She asked the defendant, 'What happened to clothes?' And he said at that time that he had taken then off. And he started to touch breast, while she was still unconscious, with his hand.

Kamilah moved his hand away from told him to get out of the room, and let him at that point go sleep in her roommate's room, who wasn't there.

And Kamilah Willingham will tell you why she did that at that point, why she didn't kick the defendant out at that point, why she allowed him to go and stay in her roommate's room at that point. Because this was a friend of hers, a friend that she'd known for a little while at that point, and she didn't really understand what was going on at that point. So in those moments she didn't kick him out; she allowed him to sleep in her roommate's room.

At that time she tried to wake up to see what was going on, but wasn't making any sense.

She was throwing water on her, couldn't even wake her up, and when she eventually did, she said some things that didn't make any sense.

pass out again, which is what she did, and at some point she talked, Kamilah did, to the defendant again and asked him what was going on. And he admitted at that point that he had taken her shirt off. And Kamilah said, 'Well, how am I going to explain that to And at some point the defendant said, 'Well, maybe you could just tell her that you took it off.' And then when she said okay, he said, that's great, 'I owe you one.' And in the morning, he left her apartment.

When woke up in the morning she didn't have her shirt on. She didn't understand what was going on. She went out into the living room where Kamilah was at that point and was trying to figure out what had happened, why did she wake up without her shirt on.

Kamilah and were talking and trying to figure out what had happened, and they decided later that day, on the 15th of January, to send a message to the defendant to ask him what was going on. So Kamilah used her phone and sent a text to the defendant and

pregnancy test? Did you put your p in her v?' And what she meant by that was 'Did you put your penis in her vagina?' And the defendant wrote back, 'No. A finger in the v at most.'

And you'll see those text messages and the exchange that Kamilah and the defendant had on the 15th. You will also hear a recorded statement that the defendant gave in June of 2011 about the events of that night. And you'll hear that he says at various times in that statement that when they all got back to the apartment in the early-morning hours of the 15th of January, that " was out of it," in his words, and that at one point he was feeling her everywhere, including her crotch.

You'll hear that recorded statement and you'll hear the defendant in his own words about what he did in the early-morning hours of January 15th, 2011.

You'll hear from Kamilah Willingham. You'll hear from You will hear that statement.

At the end of the trial the evidence will show that the defendant went too far with that night, that she was in no position to give her consent to any kind of touching, and that when the defendant touched her breasts and touched her vaginal area, he committed

- 15 You're going to hear a lot to this story. Let me talk now about what you're going to hear. 16
- 17 Mr. Winston's 30 years old. He was born on a Marine base in Camp Lejeune, South Carolina, where his 18 father was a Marine officer. Shortly after his birth, 19 in a year a two, his family moved to Brooklyn. 20 that's where he grew up, that where his parents grew 21 up. And his father became a New York City firefighter
 - He was tested as a gifted child, along with his brother, and he was in a program, I think it was called

Prep for Prep (sounds like), which his mother was able to get the two boys to go to high school at the prestigious Phillips Andover Academy. And there was a special program for inner-city kids to go to.

He graduated Phillips Andover Academy. And then after that, you will find out he went to the University of Miami and studied computer science. But after about two-and-a-half years of studying computer science, he recognized that this was not the right education for him, and he transferred to St. John's College in New Mexico.

And when you go to St. John's College, you find out you have to begin from the beginning, you get no credits for anything that you've done. And for four years he went to St. John's College, and he took a year off to play music. And you're not graded at that school, but it's very small classes and everybody listens to everybody, anything that anybody says.

And at the end of that time, he applied to law school. And he was accepted to Stanford, Columbia, Harvard. And Harvard was the best and the place for the brightest, and he went to that law school.

And in the fall of 2010, 2009, when he started the Law School, shortly after entering the Law School, he took an elective for recording artists. There was

upper-class students there and there were first-year students. He was a first-year student. And Kamilah Willingham, she was an upper-class student; she was a second-year student. And she picked him to be in her group, and the two of them became very close friends.

And about a week or so after Kamilah Willingham met him, they had a very minimal romantic interlude. In other words, after they went to a party she invited him over to her house with her girlfriend, and they kissed and hugged at the party. And you'll find out that Kamilah Willingham said, her story of this little interlude, was little different than his. He said they went in the bedroom, they kissed, they made out, they got a little bit undressed, and he left. She said he pushed her into the bedroom, that she was laughing at him.

But more or less, up until this point they both agreed, they had no romantic relationship, but they stayed as very close friends. And they would meet on this course all over the campus, and she would take him to her apartment once in a while to study. And shortly after this he concluded he did not want a romantic relationship with Kamilah, and he felt she didn't want one with him. And so they were good friends.

She had a boyfriend. And by the summer of 2010

they basically faded from each other. He heard nothing from her during the summer. He went back to school in the fall.

And in the fall, around, some time around November, you will find out that Kamilah Willingham started to make contact with him. And he liked her. She was a good person. She was tall and beautiful. And they were friends.

And they went out to some clubs. They went out to Ryles and the House of Blues. You're gonna see some pictures there. And for the first time, Brandon

Winston met her friend, He had never met her before, he had no relationship with her. He felt she was a good-looking woman. He was not spending any time trying to have any interest with her.

And then comes December. And you're gonna see a series, there's a series of text messages in which Kamilah Willingham reaches out to Brandon, 'Hey, BJ, where are you?' And she starts asking him out. And he is never available; he's always doing something else. And he had a girlfriend he was breaking up with, and he's just not available. But she keeps reaching out.

And then she's in Africa. And she goes to

Africa with and she sends him a video

message from Africa with a picture, an attractive

picture of her. And this had not happened before. So she's reaching out to him, trying to makes some contact.

She comes back from Africa. In fact, she brings him a very nice gift from the Masai tribe, a musical instrument. And each time he calls he's very friendly to her; he's brought up to be very polite.

And they can't seem to get together. But at one point in January, they do get together, and they have some very personal conversations when they get together. He's telling her about the breakup with his girlfriend, and she's telling him this very close friend of hers that she's had since Newton High School, even before Newton High School, a ten-year friend, she's had some problems with her, but she's not telling

And then after that, Brandon Winston gets a text message -- by the way, he gets a text message at some point around one o'clock in the morning to come over and see Kamilah. He doesn't answer it.

He gets another text message on the 13th, 'Where are you? Come out.' And he doesn't answer that.

At some point before she says she wants to go out with him on her birthday. She's showing a lot of

interest.

Finally, they do get together. He works, he was working on a project at the Law School, and he goes over her house. And they're there for about two hours alone; this is Kamilah Willingham and Brandon. And she's giving him a special concoction of drinks that she's made, some kind of Bailey's and cream. And she's showing him these beautiful pictures of Africa that mostly, which took. And she brings out cocaine.

And there's another law student that came over, and they share this cocaine. She's gonna say she didn't see the cocaine, she did not take any cocaine. She comes along later, she comes to the house later.

They're all friends, they're all friendly, they're all laughing and having a great time. They leave together, by plan, for the Middlesex Lounge.

Both Kamilah Willingham's home is on Mass. Ave. and the Middlesex Lounge in on Mass. Ave. But it's along the other side, it's towards Central Square. They're on the other side of Harvard.

So they go to the Middlesex Lounge. And you're gonna find a little different story from Mr. Winston than you are from Kamilah Willingham. When he first got there, he was very happy. It was the end of the week. He put up a tab; even though he doesn't have a

lot of money, he put up a tab. He spent over a hundred-and-something dollars on drinks. He bought drinks for everybody, for himself, and for strangers.

And he's dancing with strangers. And Kamilah Willingham's dancing. And dancing. Everybody's a bit tipsy.

And by the way, when he was back in the apartment, Kamilah Willingham wanted to send a, sort of, a video to her mother. So you'll see this video of Brandon and Kamilah and another student, that's on the video. And you're gonna see the picture. And you'll also see a picture of Brandon and Kamilah with in one of the clubs that they told you that they met, and also when Brandon and Kamilah were alone.

So he's dancing around with everybody. And Kamilah's dancing with everybody. And about halfway through the time he's there, comes up to him and they start dancing. And it's not, like, just dancing and playing around; she starts kissing him and he starts kissing her. And they are making out for about an hour. Not just straight, but there is a lot of contact between these two people. They are hugging and kissing, and he's touching her, she's touching him. It is a very sexual dancing that's occurring between them. And it goes on. And he's gonna tell you Kamilah had to

see this. The Middlesex Lounge is not that big a place.

And he was surprised and he was excited by this woman. And she's drunk, but she's functioning.

Kamilah Willingham will say she fell flat on her face, that one time she had high heels and she tripped. No. She didn't fall flat. She was talking to people. She was dancing around. And Kamilah Willingham, who was her good friend, who is gonna say, 'Oh she was sick,' she did nothing to take her out of there; she was chasing after another man, a man by the name of Ziggy who was there.

Finally the lights come on in the club, and they start to leave. And at first Brandon sees talking to a lot of men. He was thinking maybe she's not even coming back and maybe she's not interested. But no, she comes back, they go outside, and Kamilah Willingham takes pictures of the two of them outside.

And they have to go about a hundred feet or more to get the cab. Kamilah goes to get the cab, and Brandon and are walking. He's attracted to he wants this to continue with the two of them.

They go and they drive towards Kamilah's apartment. Brandon had left his bag at the apartment. So he gets off, and they leave to go to the apartment.

- 1 And he sees Kamilah walking, and is following her.
- 2 And there's a barrier in the road; it goes up about a
- 3 foot and a half. He sees them crossing over the
- 4 barrier, going up the stairs to the apartment. I don't
- 5 think he sees them going up the stairs; they get across
- 6 the street, and he goes into the Bank of America to get
- 7 some money. And then he comes back, and he wants to go
- 8 up. And he asks Kamilah before that, 'Can I stay
- 9 over?' And she says yes.
- So he goes up and he gets to the buzzer. And
- 11 you can't get in unless you press something to,
- 12 somebody has to let you in. He doesn't know the code.
- 13 He's been there only a few times before. Kamilah is
- 14 going to say somehow he just was able to walk in, walk
- 15 into this stairway. He's gonna tell you that's not
- 16 true.
- And you're gonna see where the buzzer is. It's
- 18 halfway down the corridor of her apartment.
- He gets up to the top of the stairs. The door
- 20 is a little ajar because obviously somebody had buzzed
- 21 him in, made the door ajar. And he goes into the
- 22 apartment.
- Kamilah is gonna say the two of them, meaning
- 24 her and were standing on the stairs, at the top
- of the stairs, and had made a clear statement,

- understandable statement, to her, to Kamilah. Somehow she's supposed to be completely out of it? She's making a statement.
 - He's gonna tell you he goes in, he goes down the corridor. He sees in the bed. She's fully dressed. He goes down and sits down beside her.
 - He asks her to get up. She gets up. They start kissing again. She kisses him, he kisses her. It's mutual.
- He tries to take off her shirt. He can't get it off. He says to her, 'Lift your arms up.' She lifts her arms up. He takes off her shirt. And then he tries to take her bra off. He can't. He falls asleep.
 - That's the end of it. He does not -- he will have no memory of that he was touching her. They were mutually, consensually making out. She was making out with him. And he falls asleep.
 - He will say it did not happen that Kamilah sat between them and tried to push between them and he pushed her aside. That's something you're going to hear.
- He says he's woken up in the middle of the night. True. And Kamilah is starting to kiss him. He turns over -- he doesn't know it's Kamilah; he thinks

it's ____ -- and within 30 seconds to a minute he knows that it's not ____ who he's interested in. And he pulls down, stops, he rejects her.

And Kamilah says to him, 'Oh, you've got a wife at home.' And he says, 'Should I go on the couch, sleep on the couch?'

Kamilah says, 'No, go to my roommate's room.'

That's what you're going to hear from Mr.

Winston.

You're gonna hear that Kamilah Willingham, she says that she was attacked by him in there, she was attacked by him. She says that he was putting his hands in her pants, that he was kissing her breasts, that he was touching her all over. There are no charges, you're going to hear, by Kamilah Willingham. And that somehow when she's in the middle of this attack, the middle of this attack she's slapping him, pushing his hand away, pulling his hair, she suddenly says, 'Why is Naked?' It's ridiculous. 'Why is naked?' And then he says, 'Ha ha,' and puts his hands on breast.

This did not happen. You'll find that out.

He goes to his bedroom and falls asleep. When I say his bedroom, the roommate's room. In the room you'll hear that Kamilah Willingham claims that she

- 1 went into his bedroom and that he was half asleep -- he
- 2 does not remember this -- but she asked him what
- 3 happened and he says, 'Nothing. Nothing. We were
- 4 making out and I fell asleep.' You'll see the
- 5 statement that she makes, and you'll hear it, to the
- 6 grand jury. And then he says that he gets up to leave,
- 7 and she asked him why is shirt off.
- Now, this is the man that's supposedly attacked
- 9 her. She says, 'Why is shirt off'?
- 'I took it off.' He didn't think there was
- anything wrong with it. This was cool, this was nice.
- And she says, 'Oh, but going to be very
- 13 upset. What am I gonna tell These are grown-
- 14 ups. These are people in their middle 20's.
- And Brandon says, you know, 'You can tell her
- 16 you put it, you can put her shirt on if you want.' He
- 17 thought it was ridiculous. This was a woman that was
- 18 making out with him for an hour in the club.
- So then, the next day, you're gonna see a
- 20 series of text messages going back and forth, where
- 21 he's being accused by his friend. He's trying to
- 22 mollify her. She's angry with him. She's going after
- 23 him. She's not stopping.
- He did nothing wrong. He says that, he did
- 25 nothing, 'At most, I touched her.' 'Just like you and

me,' he says, 'just like when we were making out.'

And she can't stop. She can't stop.

But then she says they have to talk, and they
go to the Cambridge Commons to talk. And she says, 'I
found a condom, I found a condom in the apartment.'
She's claiming she found a condom on the top of the
wastebasket. And she says, 'Did you rape, did you rape
I'm bringing this to the police. I'm bringing
this to the police.'

And that condom -- he gets scared. He says, 'I didn't do anything.' But he's thinking, 'Was I drunk?

Did I do something I didn't know about and was there something that I did that was wrong?'

Well, at some point that condom was tested. It was tested for DNA. And you're gonna get a stipulation, and that stipulation is going to tell you that on that condom it was Kamilah's and an unknown man. And there was no test made of Mr. Winston, no test made of Mr. Winston. And she had to know it was hers. And Mr. Winston, with our help, went and had the DNA tested, and it was not him, it was not. And that's a stipulation. A stipulation means that's undisputed evidence. And you're gonna find out that it was not, it was not his.

She was after him. He rejected her after all
